Why Study Abroad?

- **Economics:**

- The JC has the lowest tuition of any California college— what you pay here is what you pay to go to school in Spain. PLUS there are scholarships AND you can use your Financial Aid!

- **Education:**

- You'll learn in ways not possible here at home
- Your transcripts and university applications will demonstrate that you're a serious student who's also a global citizen

- Live for 14 weeks in a shared apartment or in a Home Stay with a Spanish host family
- Take classes Monday through Thursday, then use the long weekend for study, exploration, and travel
- Includes some day trips, a city travel pass, the ArtTicket for museum visits, and access to a variety of cultural activities, such as cooking classes, flamenco shows, art workshops, tastings, walking tours, sporting events, etc.
- Earn 12 lower division units that are degree-applicable/transferable for Bachelor's degree credit in just 4 months!
