ILC LECTURE & TOUR

This was followed by a walking tour on Thursday, focusing on Florence during the 1930s and 1940s and the impact of Fascism on the city.



THIS COMING WEEK...


This week, students are focused on quizzes, exams, projects, and presentations as spring break begins this weekend. Time flies—we're already halfway through the semester!
