Students found fresh tomatoes to make bruschetta for the appetizer, fresh vegtables like mushrooms, onions, carrots and celery to make a vegetarian ragu with fettucini pasta. They also purchased chicken to make a chicken marsala second dish. Their meal ended with panna cotta, a milky, jello-like chocolate dessert from Northern Italy. Students were also able to try a few samples at the market including truffle oil and honey, pistacchio cream and Italian biscuits called Cantucci. What a great way to start the weekend!



EUROPEAN UNION HISTORICAL ARCHIEVES LECTURE

Friday, Students from the English 100 class listened to a lecture in the AIFS Study Center by Dr.
