

Santa Rosa Junior College Study Abroad Faculty Application Summer 2023

Program Highlights:

- The summer program is a relatively new addition to the SRJC Study Abroad menu of programs and is unique in that it is limited to only SRJC faculty and both adjunct faculty and regular faculty are eligible. Please note that adjunct faculty must team up with a contract faculty member for any proposal. In the fall and spring study abroad semesters, SRJC participates in the Northern California Study Abroad Consortium, a four-district alliance consisting of SRJC, Los Rios, Contra Costa, and San Mateo districts.
- Instructors design a 6 7-unit instructor-led study abroad program. The field(s) of study is open as is the locale. Applicants should review the locations where the American Institute for Foreign Study (AIFS), our study abroad liaison, currently runs programs. A list is attached. If you are interested in an alternate location, please contact Kerry Loewen, Dean of Study Abroad to confirm feasibility.
- The length of the program may run anywhere from 3 to 6 weeks. Six-week programs are common as they allow a good balance of class time, homework and local activities and exploration, but shorter programs are less expensive. Hybrid classes can be considered as long as the course is fully contained within the summer term. Any hybrid classwork outside of the actual trip should be completed before the trip begins. The program should be complete when the students return.
- Faculty must recruit 22 to 35 students. Higher numbers usually will reduce the overall cost for students.
- While not required, the Study Abroad Committee recommends that two instructors plan a summer program as a team (at least one must be contract faculty). Courses from different disciplines increase the potential pool of participants. For example, a photography and English instructor have teamed up for a trip to Ireland. A biology and a language instructor linked a 2-unit biology class and a 4-unit Spanish language class for a program in Costa Rica. More recently, a humanities and archeology course in Rome were successfully marketed to both SRJC and the county at large.
- SRJC contracts with AIFS, for travel, housing and field trip arrangements. They also provide 24/7 emergency support while on location.
- The faculty are solely responsible for recruiting students for their program and should plan a variety of recruiting activities including scheduling class visits, 9 16 informational meetings during the day and evening during the two semesters preceding the summer abroad, and other recruiting activities. SRJC Faculty Benefits:

- Live and teach abroad for 3 to 6 weeks. Travel on your own before or after the session.
- All faculty, full-time or part-time, are paid at the hourly instructional rate.
- Faculty are compensated for recruiting at least 22 students during the preceding spring semester, to be paid 5% Base Hourly Salary (Schedule II), amounting to 30 hours base hourly pay (no exceptions).
- Airfare is paid by AIFS.
- Faculty are provided with a housing stipend and assistance in acquiring appropriate accommodations. The actual stipend amount will vary by location and student enrollment based on the AIFS contract.

- Faculty must pay all other costs, such as food, entertainment, and housing costs in excess of the housing stipend.
- Full participation in all scheduled activities on the same basis as the students, including transfers, entrances, sightseeing tours, etc.

We do not accept summer applications for London, Florence or Barcelona.

Other locations are possible. The committee will consider if the program is financially reasonable and appealing to students. Please contact Kerry Loewen, supervising administrator for Study Abroad, as soon as you identify an alternative location to confirm its feasibility before applying.
